Presenter: Narration (SCORM) vs. Video (MP4) Option

The purpose of this guide is to assist you in deciding between creating a narrative SCORM file and Video MP4 recording for your presentation.

Before we start you should read both the guide to **Transferring files in iSpring 7 and Presenter** and the guide on **Creating SCORM packages in iSpring 7**.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Records audio narrations ▪ Can edit audio narrations ▪ Can import audio files to slides ▪ Can resync PowerPoint animations to narration ▪ Can update slides after recording ▪ Can insert video files to slides ▪ Can include quiz and interactive elements to slides ▪ Can insert video and flash animations ▪ Can see your slide notes while you record 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Records both the webcam and the screen simultaneously ▪ Can record your full screen ▪ Can rotate between the screen capture, the webcam video and both the screen and video together ▪ Can edit the recorded video ▪ Can rerecord video

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Cannot embed YouTube videos ▪ Flash videos are not viewable on Mobile devices ▪ It doesn't record your webcam and slides at the same time. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Cannot edit slides once recorded ▪ Cannot have any quizzes or interactivity ▪ Cannot embed YouTube videos ▪ Cannot see your slide notes while you record

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Publishes to a SCORM package, Flash and HTML5 ▪ Upload to Moodle via SCORM (Maximum upload 200mb) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Publishes to MP4 ▪ Upload to the Box then link to Moodle
What do you need to consider?	What do you need to consider?
<p>If you want to easily adapt and change your slides, have quizzes, and want more interactivity this option might be best for you.</p>	<p>If you want to have a video where you are lecturing to your slides and do not plan to make changes in the future, this is the best option for you. (To edit your slides you will need to rerecord)</p>
